Please join us to meet and hear Jenean Hampton. She was born and raised in inner city Detroit. Jenean grew up in a less than ideal financial situation, but found inspiration in NASA's space program. When the family acquired a television, Jenean watched and was inspired by space mission launches and landings. Her excitement in the program and reading helped Jenean form a positive, optimistic outlook. After high school, Jenean worked five years in the automotive industry to help pay for college and graduated from Wayne State University in 1985. Shortly after graduation she joined the U.S. Air Force as a computer systems officer, writing computer code and testing software. She was deployed to Operation Desert Storm in Saudi Arabia. While stationed in Riyadh, Saudi Arabia, Jenean, an Air Force Captain, was responsible for critical radar software used in both search and rescue missions and tracking enemy planes. After the Air Force, Jenean began a 19-year career in the corrugated packaging industry. Jenean has been married 14 years to Dr. Doyle Isaak, a retired U.S. Air Force officer. They live in Bowling Green where Jenean is active in the community. As a supporter of constitutionally limited government, Jenean serves as a strong conservative voice in Kentucky.

Flo Alfred is our member of the month for October. She was born in Corbin, Ky and remembers her father talking about politics. She remembers him voting for Wendell Wellkie and Thomas E. Dewey, of course, neither won. Flo recently visited Cumberland Falls and the DuPont Lodge. It was such a special time for her since her father helped build the lodge. She went around touching the stones savoring the experience and wondering how many of the stones her father had touched. Those are memories that she will always hold dear. She is very proud of her heritage. There was not much money, but a loving family, a clean house and a garden. Flo was 12 when her family moved to Northern Kentucky. She attended John G Carlisle then to Holmes High School. She then attended business school. She worked at ATT & Cincinnati Bell until retirement in 1982.

After she retired, she had more time to get involved in politics and volunteer work. She was on the Auxiliary Board at St. Luke Hospital doing fundraising, has been involved with the Salvation Army for a long time doing fundraising for many projects and, of course, working with KCRWC. Flo has walked the 5K for the last several years to raise money for the for the Northern Kentucky 9/11 Memorial that was dedicated on Friday, September 11, 2015, at the Crescent Springs Community Park in Crescent Springs where she won several gold medals for completing the 5K.

She has fond memories of getting interested in politics and always wanted to stay informed. She met Clyde and Mary Middleton in the '60s. Flo still has a note Mary wrote her regarding the Children's after school programs which Flo helped raise money to fund and support.

Flo remembers the Republican Headquarters, a small storefront in Covington, and the night Gene Snyder won has seat in the House of Representatives. She has a picture with a group of Gene Snyder supporters standing in front of the headquarters after he won the election. She was active in the campaigns of Clyde Middleton and Jim Bunning. She remembers sitting next to Edna Whitus making calls for the candidates. Flo is a breast cancer survivor. She was initially diagnosed in 2001, but then again in 2009 and 2014. She was nominated as a cancer survivor and invited to walk the track at Churchill Downs for the 136th running of the Kentucky Oaks where cancer survivors are recognized.

Flo was nominated and recognized in 2001 as KCRWC's Honoree. This year she was named the "Best Dressed" woman at KCRWC's Picnic/Luau in July. She feels that she is the most blessed woman on the planet. She is so blessed to have met so many people and had the opportunity to be involved with so many wonderful groups and organizations.

#### HERE'S THE RECIPE FROM THE WINNER OF THE SECOND ANNUAL CHILI COOKOFF KATIE SHUMATE'S WHITE CHICKEN CHILI

- 2 cans cannelloni (or great northern) beans
  1 large onion chopped
  4 oz unsalted butter
  1/4 cup flour
  1-1/2 cups chicken broth (more can be added if chili is too thick)
  2 cups half and half
  1 tsp Tabasco (or more to taste)
  1-1/2 tsp chili powder
  1 tsp cumin
  1/2 tsp salt
  1/2 tsp pepper
  2 4 oz cans chopped green chilies
  1 1/2 lba capled chicken broacte, out into pippen
- 1-1/2 lbs cooked chicken breasts- cut into pieces

Sauté onions in half of butter until soft. In separate heavy pan melt remaining butter and whisk in flour to create a roux. Cook, whisking constantly for approx 3 minutes (do not burn). Stir in onion, broth and half and half whisking constantly until thickened. Bring to a boil, and then simmer 5 minutes. Stir in rest of the ingredients and simmer 20 minutes.

Serve with hot sauce, Monterey Jack cheese, sour cream, and crackers
