The 2016 Kentucky Republican Presidential Caucus will take place on Saturday, March 5, 2016, at caucus locations in counties across the state. Kenton County's Caucus will be held at

Voting hours are 10:00 am - 4:00 pm local time. Only registered Republicans are eligible to vote on March 5. Voters must be registered Republicans by December 31, 2015. Every county Republican Party has the option to hold a caucus or conduct a regional caucus with neighboring counties. A typical county party will hold its own caucus in one location. The most populous counties will have multiple caucus locations. Presidential candidates must file their declaration of candidacy with the Republican Party of Kentucky by January 7, 2016. KCRWC's Member of the Month is Linda Geisselbrecht. She was born in Springfield, MA to Fritz and Lina Schumacher, and went to schools there graduating from Classical High School. She was brought up with the German language at home, and wanted to become a German teacher, but majored in mathematics at Westfield State College, Westfield, MA. On December 26, 1964, she married Hartmut, and they moved to Colorado Springs, CO where he was stationed at Ft. Carson. After they returned to Massachusetts, their beautiful daughter Lynn was born, and they lived in their first home in Longmeadow. While there, she became involved in the Newcomers Club, was a VBS teacher at the Lutheran Church, and sang with the Springfield Turnverein Ladies Glee Club.

In 1972, Hartmut was transferred to Lancaster, PA, as manager of several departments at ITT Grinnell. While there, she started singing in the church choir and at the Lancaster Liederkranz. She was also involved in the Newcomers Club holding several offices.

In 1978, they moved back to Massachusetts, and Hartmut became a Vice President at Klockner-Desma. She started working in the Fiscal Services Department at Emerson Hospital as the Accounts Payable Coordinator. After getting her A.S. Degree in Accounting and B.S. Degree in Business Administration from Northeastern University, Boston, MA, she took the position of Accounts Payable Supervisor at St. Elizabeth Hospital in Brighton, MA. She also became a partner in an upscale greeting card company - Communicards.



In 1987, they moved to Villa Hills because Klockner transferred Hartmut. They began serving in NKY. After her first Sunday at Gloria Dei Lutheran Church, Mary Middleton asked her to come to the next KCRWC Meeting, and then also to the next St. Luke Hospital Auxiliary meeting, and later to the Salvation Army Auxiliary meeting, and KSO Gala Committee meeting. Mary was her mentor, and she got her involved in many political and charitable organizations. Linda has received many awards and much recognition for the work she has done in NKY. She held most every office in KCRWC and was recognized as Woman of the Year. In 2013, she received the Clyde and Mary Middleton Lifetime Achievement Award given by the Kenton County Republican Party.

Linda has worked on many political campaigns - Jim Bunning, Clyde Middleton, Dick Combs, Geoff Davis, Chris Mehling, and many more. She has held various positions in KCRWC, St. Luke Auxiliary, on KSO Gala Committee, at Gloria Dei, and at Kolping Saengerchor. During the '90s, she started teaching German for NKU's Community Education. She started her own company, German-American Business Concepts, and taught German for several companies in this area - Sachs Automotive, ZF Lemforder, Krauss-Maffei, RAJones, and Hubert Company.

In 2002, Linda ran for Kenton County Magistrate, and beat the incumbent of 13 years. She served in this office until 2007, when she became Staff Assistant for U.S. Senator Jim Bunning. After Senator Bunning retired and the office closed, she tutored and taught German. At the present time, Linda is teaching English as a Second Language (ESL) for Conversa Language Center in Cincinnati. "I love being with young people and helping them to learn the English language and our customs and traditions."

But their greatest achievement is being the proud parents of Lynn and Joe Berk, and grandparents of AJ Berk, a sophomore at Georgetown College in Georgetown, KY majoring in International Business. He received a tennis scholarship, is a member of the tennis team, a Residence Assistant, and has a 3.8 GPA.
